

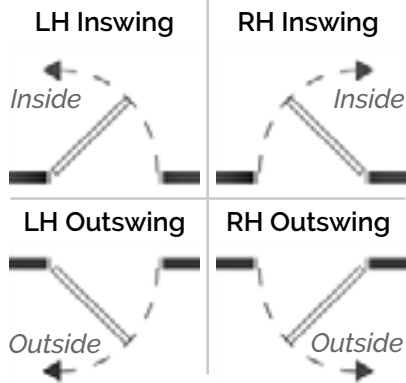
Door Measurement Worksheet

Step 1: Determine the type of door needed for each location:

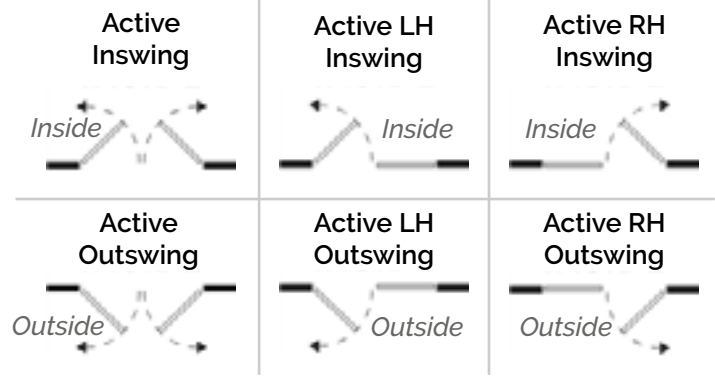


Step 2: To determine the swing or "handing" for the door, face the current door or opening from the outside then imagine which hand will be used to grab the handle. Next, determine whether the door will swing inward or out.

Single Door Handing



Double Door Handing



Step 3: For new doors, measure the width & height of the Rough Opening for each door. The rough opening should be approximately 2" wider than the door to allow for the jambs. For replacement doors, measure the existing door width, height, & depth.
